- The median cost of afterschool programs accounts for 10-12% of a family's household budget (Dept. of Labor), putting programs out of reach for many low-income families.
- With cuts in federal dollars, afterschool and summer program providers may be at risk of reducing their services and leave thousands of children without access to the critical support they need.
